Equestrian Canada Sanctioned Competition

The Glanbrook Cadora Bronze and Silver competitions are sanctioned competitions of Equestrian Canada (EC), 11 Hines Rd, Suite 201, Ottawa, ON K2K2X1 and are governed by the [Rules of EC](#). Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

Competitors are responsible for knowledge of the rules.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. **Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.**

Statement of Principles – Horse Welfare

(from the Equestrian Canada Code of Conduct and Ethics)

Equestrian Canada (EC) supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures. Individuals who interact with horses must also adhere to EC's policies as they relate to horse welfare.

Silver Competition: USEF Introductory Tests "A", "B", "C"; USEF Training Level Tests 1, 2, 3; USEF First Level Tests 1, 2, 3; USEF Second Level Test 1, 2, 3; USEF Third Level Test 1; 2, 3; Fourth Level Test 1, 2, 3; USEF First – Fourth Level Freestyles, FEI Prix St. George; Intermediate 1.

TESTS

- All tests (Bronze, Western and Silver competition) will be ridden in a 20x60 m ring.
- The Training Level through Fourth Level Tests are USEF 2023 tests available on the EC [website](#). The Training Level through Fourth Level Freestyle Tests are also USEF 2023 tests. FEI Prix St. George, Intermediate 1 are offered in the Silver classes.
- Junior divisions will be held in Walk/Trot, Training and First Levels of Bronze shows if there are at least two junior entries and in all classes and levels of Silver shows if there are at least two junior entries.
- Introductory Tests are USEF "A" - C" 2023. Note Introductory C has a canter requirement.

GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

Coaches: Effective 2022, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC-sanctioned events. When registering for EC-sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

Vaccinations: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

Memberships Required: Both the rider and owner of horses competing in Bronze competition must be members of Ontario Equestrian (OE) and hold an EC Bronze License (minimum). Those entering Silver competition must be members of OE and hold an EC Silver License (minimum). All entries must include a photocopy of their current membership cards.

Horse Licence: Horses in Silver competition must have an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete or, if owned by a Temporary Sport License holder, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. The Horse Recording must be provided to the Competition Secretary before a horse will be allowed to compete. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A403/A404) For information and application, contact 1-613-287-1515 or [EC Horse Recordings](#). Not required for Bronze competition.

Western Competition: Every entry at a [WSDAC](#)-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, or rider and horse shall be subject to the WSDAC constitution and all rules of WSDAC and any

additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in WSDAC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the constitution and the applicable rules of WSDAC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Scores for WSDAC competitors will be submitted to WSDAC by Glanbrook CADORA.

Amateur: If you are competing in the Amateur classes, you must have the Amateur Status box marked on your EC card.

Protective Headgear: All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. Note: At the tack check that follows the test, the steward may ask the athlete to dismount so that the helmet can be inspected for safety standard labeling. (see E 4.0 Safety Headgear).

Return to Sport Rule: Equestrian Canada has implemented a concussion-related policy, [Article A101 Accidents & Return to Sport](#) in the General Regulations. Glanbrook shows will follow all provisions of this policy.

Safety Vests are permitted but must conform to the rules governing jacket colours (see E4.0.1 Safety Vests).

Competition numbers must be worn at all times by the horse or handler while on the show grounds for identification by the steward, or risk elimination from the show.

No lunging is permitted in the warm-up area(s).

Competition ring: On competition day, there will be no hand-walking or use of the competition ring area or inside the fenced area surrounding it, other than during the performance.

Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place in all classes. A High Point of-the-day ribbon will be awarded at each show for eligible riders in classes Training Level 1 and higher.

Tack Check: Competitors in both Bronze and Silver competitions must present themselves to the Steward for a **tack check** after completing each test. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Freestyles: All tapes/CDs should be handed to the show secretary at least one hour before the start of the Freestyle class. The CD or tape must be labeled with the horse's and rider's name and include instructions of how and when the music is to be started (e.g. rider will wave hand at K). Electronic forms of music (e.g. iPod) will not be available.

Caller's dress code: Smart casual. Jeans, slacks, and mid length shorts are permitted. Tank tops, flip flops and sandals are not allowed. Inappropriately dressed callers may not be allowed to call a test (See E9.1)

First Aid: A certified First Aid service will be available on-site.

A **veterinarian** and **farrier** will be on-call for equine emergencies.

Dogs are best left at home. If brought to the show site, they must be leashed at all times.

Stabling will be available at the Ancaster Fairground shows and must be paid in advance, including any shavings ordered and a deposit for clean-out. All stalls will be clean and sanitized (stalls are scrubbed with disinfectant once a month and misted weekly with a disinfectant), before you arrive but feel free to sanitize your assigned stall prior to bringing your horse in. For stabled horses, you must post a Stall Card (this will be provided by the show) on the stall door to display the horse's name, entry number, the name and number of the contact person who is available at the show, as well as horse temperature readings.

Biosecurity Requirements for all Competitors

Protect horses from the spread of infectious diseases by following these good stable management practices:

- To protect horse health, we encourage **temperature monitoring**. We ask that you take the temperature of your horse before leaving for the show and again a few hours after arriving. A normal horse temperature is between 37.2 – 38.3° C. Any temperature over 38.8° C (102° F) must be reported to the horse show office and/or horse show veterinarian. If your horse has a high temperature indicating sickness, please do not come to the show. Following the competition, it is recommended that all horses be isolated at their home facility for 21 days prior to reintroduction to other horses. If this is not possible, be sure to observe all horses carefully for 21 days. Following the competition, all horses should have temperatures taken twice a day for four days, and be observed for abnormal behavior and signs of cough, nasal discharge, discomfort or lameness.
- Do not share feed/water containers or buckets between horses and do not use communal water troughs. While filling a bucket, do not let the hose end touch the bucket or the water in a bucket.
- Sharing tack and equipment puts horses at risk and is not recommended. If tack/equipment must be used by multiple horses, be sure to clean/disinfect it between uses by different horses.

- Observe good hygiene around all horses on the grounds, and especially after handling a teammate's horse, prior to touching your horse.
- Wash hands immediately with soap and water, or use disinfectant hand solution after handling horses, especially after contact with the mouth, nose or feces.
- Hand sanitizers are available. Please use them and indicate the importance of their use to your friends, family, and casual visitors.
- Do not allow nose-to-nose contact between horses.
- Do not permit your horse to lick or sniff surfaces in common areas. If this does occur, please use a disinfectant wipe on the area.
- If sharing a wheelbarrow, please do not bring it into your horse's stall. Leave it in the aisle.
- Please dispose of manure in designated areas only. Do not put trash in manure pile.
- If your horse develops a fever or signs of illness, contact the show steward or show secretary, immediately.
- Use fly spray or topical application to repel insects. Presence of insects is a breach of biosecurity and prevention will help control the spread of disease.
- Keep horse feed in closed containers and clean up any spills that might attract rodents and insects. The presence of insects and rodents is a breach of biosecurity and prevention will help control the spread of disease.

Alternative and/or additional information on any competition will be included in the Glanbrook Cadora newsletter and posted on the Glanbrook Cadora website (www.glanbrookcadora.com) and the FaceBook page – Glanbrook Cadora.

COVID-19: This event will comply with local public health guidelines. As precautions, we recommend the use of face masks inside washrooms and the show office and encourage physical distancing.

Neither Glanbrook Cadora, the show management and volunteers, show officials, property owners nor their employees will be in any way responsible for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors or spectators.

ENTRIES

- All entries must be submitted through the CompeteEasy App- www.competeeasy.com. You will set up an account and complete all the information. The Glanbrook show will be listed and entered according to the prompts.
- A parent or guardian must sign the entry form of a minor child/Junior competitor (under 18 years of age). Parents/guardians are not required to have an EC Sport Licence provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book and acknowledge that they are liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violations of the EC Rules by their minor child. (See A801.6, A213.2).
- Entries from members “Not in Good Standing” will be refused.
- More than one rider may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing that the horse/pony is not entered by two riders in the same class. A horse/rider combination may compete in any two, but only two consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day including the freestyle for Introductory, Training and First levels, and three tests per day including freestyle for Second, Third and Fourth levels. (E7.11.9)
- **Hors concours** (non-competitive) entries may be accepted with permission of the show manager. Entry will pay full entry fee and is subject to all EC rules but is not eligible for prizes, placings or awards. (See Article E.7.11.11).
- **Substitution** of horse or rider requests received after the closing date are at the discretion of the show manager.
- **Cancellations/Refunds:** Cancellations may be made up until the closing date with no penalty. After the closing date, a veterinary or medical certificate (on official letterhead) is required and entry fees will be refunded (upon notification by 6:00 PM on the Friday preceding the competition date). Presentation of a veterinary or medical certificate, on official letterhead, for illness or injury **must be made within 15 days after the competition in order to receive a refund. Cancellations made the day of the competition will forfeit the entries (please notify the secretary’s desk if you are cancelling). Glanbrook Cadora regrets that refunds cannot be issued for classes cancelled due to inclement weather conditions. If you are unable to compete for other reasons, entry fees cannot be refunded. To help us to run our competitions effectively, please be courteous and

notify the competition if you must cancel.

FEES

- Entry Fee per test is \$30 for Glanbrook Cadora members and \$35 for non-members.
- Drug testing fee per entry (\$4.00 for Bronze and \$8 for Silver). Note that any entry may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)
- A \$20 Administration Fee per entry supports attendance of certified first aid service.
- A Dressage Levy of \$10 per entry supports EC dressage programs.
- Fees are paid through CompeteEasy. There will be a fee of 5% of all fees, added to each invoice for CompeteEasy.
- **A \$10 late fee** will be applied to any entry accepted but received after the **closing date**.

CADORA SILVER CIRCUIT GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. Complete rules for the CADORA Silver Circuit will be found in the [Silver Circuit Handbook](#) published and administered by Cadora-Ontario and will apply. **Competitors are responsible for knowledge of the rules.** Other information about CADORA and the Silver Circuit including the Silver Championships may be found on the [Cadora-Ontario website](#).

2. **Memberships: Owners and riders** of horses competing on the Silver Circuit must be Ontario Equestrian and Equestrian Canada members and have EC Silver Licenses or higher. 3. Canadian entries in Silver Competitions are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete or, if owned by a temporary sport license holder, a Temporary Horse Registration must be purchased at each competition entered. The Horse Recording must be handed in to the Competition Secretary before a horse will be allowed to compete. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A403/A404) For further information and application forms contact EC Ph; 1-613-287-1515 or refer to the [EC website](#).

4. **Entry fees:** For Silver Competitions, entry fees for Glanbrook Cadora members will be \$30.00/class and \$35.00/class for non-members. Fees may be submitted by e-transfer to glanbrookcadora@gmail.com. Entry forms and membership proofs must accompany the transfer to be considered valid/complete entries.

5. All tests at Glanbrook Cadora **SILVER** Competitions will be ridden in the **20 X 60m** arena.

GLANBROOK CADORA ANNUAL AWARDS

RIDER/HORSE OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Gold, silver and bronze medallions will be awarded (based on points accumulated throughout the season) in each of Walk/Trot, Training Level Test 1, Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth Levels and Freestyle classes. To be eligible for **Glanbrook Cadora club awards**, membership in Cadora Inc., Cadora-Ontario and Glanbrook Cadora must be obtained for **both rider and owner** of the horse by the end of the first competition of the current season and the horse/rider combination must show in a minimum of **three** Glanbrook Cadora Silver and/or Bronze competitions in 2023.

Points for placings will be awarded in the following manner:

1st - 6 points	4th - 3 point
2nd - 5 points	5th - 2 points
3rd - 4 points	6th - 1 point

These awards are for **horse/rider** combinations.

Don Barnes Vintage Rider Award – criteria – Glanbrook Cadora member, highest scoring senior rider in a Silver or Bronze class of in-person show EXCLUDING Intro Division – rider 50 years or older, sign in sheet at show to enter age of rider, no fees to enter other than class fees - **\$100 cash prize – presented at the Annual General Meeting**

Glanbrook CADORA High Point of the Year- criteria- senior Glanbrook CADORA member highest score of the year- horse/ rider combination, bronze or silver. Presented at the Annual General Meeting and Sponsored by **Mary Jo Figueira**.

High point Canadian Breed horse Glanbrook CADORA **member test score of 3 shows** – one year end award of \$100 sponsored by Alison Laurie.

Western Dressage bronze division – Glanbrook CADORA **member junior or senior rider**– highest score from the 3 shows – one year end prize awarded at the Annual General Meeting

Junior Year end High Point Award- Glanbrook CADORA member-highest scoring junior rider (17 years or younger) competing in either silver or bronze- high point over 3 in-person shows. Prize presented at the Annual General Meeting- Sponsored by Alison Moeller

A **New Member High Point Award** will be presented at the Annual General Meeting for the same **horse/rider** combination that joined in 2023. The rider must be a Glanbrook Member, in good standing. The award is given to the new member with the highest score at the in-person shows at the Annual General Meeting.

MIKE VAN DYK MEMORIAL TROPHY

This Trophy will not be awarded in 2023.

VOLUNTEER AWARDS AND INCENTIVES

An engraved plaque is awarded to a volunteer who provides extraordinary service to Glanbrook shows and events through assistance with particular projects such as finding sponsorships or by hours of support given to support the club. This individual is identified by the Glanbrook executive members.

Monetary incentive awards in the form of gift cards are presented to volunteers based on the number of hours given to Glanbrook shows and events.

Volunteer awards are presented at either the show or the Annual General Meeting in the fall.

WHAT MEMBERSHIPS DO I NEED FOR 2023?

For the **Silver** level at the Glanbrook Cadora Dressage Shows in 2023, you will need an EC Silver Membership and an OE membership. If you are an amateur, you **must** have the Amateur Status box marked on your EC card. Your horse must have a [2023 Horse Recording](#) (this replaces the printed Horse Passport & annual sticker). If you do not own the horse, the owner must have the appropriate license and be an OE and EC member. All of the above membership forms can be found on the OE or EC websites.

If you show at the **Bronze** level at the Glanbrook Cadora Dressage Shows in 2023, you will need an EC Bronze Membership and your OE membership. If you do not own the horse, the owner must have the appropriate license and be an OE and EC member. All of the above membership forms can be found on the OE or EC websites.

Optional Memberships

Glanbrook Cadora: To be eligible for Glanbrook Cadora year end awards and a savings on your entries, you must join the group by the end of the first show of 2023. Please go to the membership tab on our website. If you do not own the horse, the **owner** must be an EC and OE member.

Cadora: To be eligible for Cadora and Cadora-Ontario awards, you need to join Cadora by July 1st of the current year. Membership includes Provincial and National Cadora membership. Members receive an Omnibus Test Booklet, membership card, Cadora Ink and Cadora-Ontario newsletters and the ability to participate in Cadora and Cadora-Ontario awards and educational programs.
