Equestrian Canada Sanctioned Competition

The Glanbrook CADORA Bronze and Silver competitions are sanctioned as Bronze and Silver competition member of Equestrian Canada (EC), c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario K1H 7X7 and are governed by the [Rules of EC](#). Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition.

Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

Statement of Principles – Horse Welfare

(from the Equestrian Canada Code of Conduct and Ethics)

Equestrian Canada (EC) supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All Participants must be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures. Individuals who interact with horses must also adhere to EC's policies as they relate to horse welfare.

TESTS

- All tests (Bronze and Silver competition) will be ridden in a 20x60 m ring.
- The Introductory Tests are 2023 USDF tests (offered in the Bronze classes), Training through Fourth Level Tests are 2023 USEF tests, the FEI Prix St. George, Intermediate I (offered in the Silver classes), and the Para Dressage tests (offered at both Bronze and Silver) are available through the EC website at <https://www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests>
- Para Dressage: All EC Para Dressage Tests are available upon request for both Bronze and Silver entries.
- Separate Junior classes will be offered for all classes and levels of both Bronze and Silver shows.

MEMBERSHIPS

Ontario Equestrian (OE) Membership and Equestrian Canada (EC) Sport Licence: Both are required for both the horse owner and rider. The Person Responsible must also have a valid EC Sport Licence. Note that if you do not own the horse, the owner must also have the appropriate license and be an OE Member and have an EC Sport Licence. All the above membership forms can be found on the OE and EC websites.

Licence status will be checked prior to the competition and no rider, coach or owner will be allowed to compete without appropriate licence. Fines can be levied by Equestrian Canada for any individuals or competitions that allow individuals to compete without the proper licence.

- **Both the rider and owner** of horses competing in **Bronze** competition must be members of Ontario Equestrian (OE) and hold an EC Bronze Licence (minimum).

- **Both the rider and owner** of horses entering **Silver** competition must be members of OE and hold an EC Silver Licence (minimum).
- **Person Responsible** must also have an EC Sport Licence.
- **Amateur Status:** If you are competing as an Amateur rider, you must have the Amateur Status added to your EC licence. OE charges an additional fee for Amateur Status. If your OE licence does not reflect Amateur Status, you may show as an Open competitor.

Temporary Sports Licence: A temporary sports licence can no longer be purchased at or through the competition. Single Event Upgrades are available for purchase **directly through the competitors MyEC portal**. There is a flat rate of \$50 per upgrade, regardless of levels being upgraded. Upgrades are not available for Platinum.

EC Horse Recording: Horses in **Silver** competition must have an EC Horse Recording and have paid the current EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete or a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. The Horse Recording must be provided to the Competition Secretary before a horse will be allowed to compete. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A403/A404) For information and application, contact 1-613-287-1515 or [EC Horse Recordings](#). EC Horse Recordings are not required for **Bronze** competition.

Glanbrook CADORA (Optional): To be eligible for Glanbrook CADORA year-end awards, the rider must be a member in good standing by July 1, 2024. In order to be eligible for member discounts on entry fees, the rider must be a member in good standing when entries are submitted. To join, you may join directly on the show entry form at www.competeeasy.com or you may access the membership form on our website at <http://www.glanbrookcadora.com/membership.html>.

Ontario Dressage (formerly CADORA Ontario) (Optional): To be eligible for CADORA Ontario awards, you need to join CADORA Ontario by July 1st of the current year. Membership includes CADORA-Ontario newsletters and the ability to participate in CADORA-Ontario awards and educational programs. Memberships can be obtained through Ontario Equestrian HORSEREG Portal if you already have or are going to have OE Membership. If you do not have OE Membership, then please contact Taylor Cornwell t.cornwell@ontarioequestrian.ca at OE Membership and she will assist you with your CADORA-Ontario Membership requirements.

CADORA INC (Optional): To be eligible for National CADORA awards, you need to join CADORA INC by July 1st of the current year. Members receive an Omnibus Test Booklet, CADORA Ink newsletters and the ability to participate in CADORA's national awards and educational programs. GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

Coaches: EC Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC-sanctioned events. Competitions must ensure all coaches named on entry form hold either EC Licenced Coach Status OR have purchased Temporary Coach Status from EC, and the Coach Status will be validated via the Competition Support Portal of the event.

When registering for EC-sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

Temporary Coach Status is now digital:

- **Temporary Coach Status is now to be purchased directly from EC via the MyEC Portal**
- Competitions must ensure all coaches named on entry hold either EC Licenced Coach Status OR have purchased Temporary Coach Status from EC
- Temporary Coach status can be validated via the Competition Support Portal of the event
- This means no more paper forms to be collected from the coach on-site.
- Temporary Coach Status is only available until the end of 2025

Vaccinations: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

Biosecurity: All competitors must be aware of and observe procedures to prevent disease spread among horses on the show grounds. Any horse exhibiting signs of illness must not be transported to the show. Vaccination certification must be submitted with entries. All horses must be temperature checked before travelling to the show. At check in, you will be asked to report the temperature of the horse before transport.

Equine Medication Control: Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location.

Protective Headgear: All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. Note: At the tack check that follows the test, the steward may ask the athlete to dismount so that the helmet can be inspected for safety standard labeling. (see Article E 4.0 Safety Headgear).

Safety Vests: Any athlete competing in an EC sanctioned dressage competition is permitted to wear a safety vest including an inflatable safety vest which attaches to the saddle. The vest must conform to the rules governing jacket colours (see Article E4.0.1 Safety Vests).

Return to Sport Rule: Equestrian Canada has implemented a concussion-related policy, Article A101 Accidents & Return to Sport in the General Regulations. Glanbrook shows will follow all provisions of this policy.

Para-Equestrian classes will be governed by EC Para rules (Section E Dressage Rulebook).

Competition numbers must be worn at all times by the horse or handler while on the show grounds for identification by the steward, or risk elimination from the show.

No lunging is permitted in the warm-up area(s).

Competition ring: On competition day, there will be no hand-walking or use of the competition ring area or inside the fenced area surrounding it, other than during the performance.

Tack Check: Competitors in both Bronze and Silver competitions must present themselves to the Steward for a **tack check** after completing each test. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Caller's dress code: Smart casual. Jeans, slacks, and mid length shorts are permitted. Tank tops, flip flops and sandals are not allowed. Inappropriately dressed callers may not be allowed to call a test (See E9.1)

First Aid: A certified First Aid service will be available on-site.

A **veterinarian** and **farrier** will be on-call for equine emergencies.

Dogs should be kept in the trailer or stabling area whenever possible and must be leashed at all times.

Stabling will be available at the Ancaster Fairground shows and must be paid in advance, including any shavings ordered and a refundable deposit for clean-out.

Alternative and/or additional information on any competition will be included in the Glanbrook CADORA newsletter and posted on the Glanbrook CADORA website (www.glanbrookcadora.com) and the FaceBook page – Glanbrook CADORA.

Neither Glanbrook CADORA, the show management and volunteers, show officials, property owners nor their employees will be in any way responsible for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors or spectators.

ENTRIES

- All entries must be submitted through the CompeteEasy App www.competeeasy.com. You will set up an account and complete all the information. The Glanbrook show will be listed and entered according to the prompts.
- The entry must be fully completed and all conditions must be accepted by the Person Responsible, who is an adult EC Sport Licence holder who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. For an adult athlete, the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner or the competitor. **NOTE:** If a parent/guardian of a Junior competitor is not listed as the Person Responsible on the online entry, the parent/guardian must complete and sign the Parent/Guardian Waiver document which can be uploaded with the show entry or emailed to the show manager. A parent/guardian is not required to have an EC Sport Licence provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book and acknowledge that they are liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violations of the EC Rules by their minor child.
- Entries from Equestrian Canada Sport Licence holders that are deemed “*not in good standing*” will be refused.
- A horse/rider combination may compete in any two, but only two, consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day for Introductory, Training and First levels, and three tests per day for Second, Third and Fourth levels and all FEI tests. More than one athlete may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing that the horse/pony is not entered by two athletes in the same class.
- **Para Dressage** entries must provide a copy of classification documentation and Para Grade. Glanbrook CADORA does not have access to any special equipment, including mounting blocks or ramps, so please contact show management prior to entry to confirm required accommodations can be met.

- **Hors concours** (non-competitive) entries may be accepted with permission of the show manager. Entry will pay full entry fee and is subject to all EC rules but is not eligible for prizes, placings or awards. (See Article E.7.11.11).
- **Schooling** is allowed on show day and rider/owner must have an OE membership, a number and paid \$25 schooling fee. All schooling entries must complete an entry form and will be subject to the same EC Rules as competitive entries while on the show grounds. They will not have access to the competition ring.
- **Substitution** of horse or rider requests received after the closing date are at the discretion of the show manager.
- **Cancellations/Refunds:** Cancellations may be made up until the closing date with no penalty. After the closing date, a veterinary or medical certificate (on official letterhead) is required and entry fees (net of administration fees and any stabling fees from the show venue) will be refunded (upon notification by 6:00 PM on the Friday preceding the competition date). Presentation of a veterinary or medical certificate, on official letterhead, for illness or injury **must be made within 15 days after the competition in order to receive a refund. - **Cancellations made the day of the competition will forfeit the entries** (please notify the secretary's desk if you are cancelling). Glanbrook CADORA regrets that refunds cannot be issued for classes cancelled due to inclement weather conditions. If you are unable to compete for other reasons, entry fees cannot be refunded. To help us to run our competitions effectively, please be courteous and notify the competition if you must cancel.

FEES

- Entry Fees for Glanbrook CADORA members after membership discounts are \$35 per class and \$30 per class for Junior riders. Entry Fees for non-members are \$40 per class and \$35 per class for Junior riders.
- Drug testing fee per entry (\$4 for Bronze and \$8 for Silver). Note that any entry may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)
- A \$25 Administration Fee per entry supports attendance of certified first aid service.
- A Dressage Levy of \$10 per entry supports EC dressage programs.
- Fees are paid through CompeteEasy. There will be a transaction fee of 5% of all fees, added to each invoice by CompeteEasy.
- **A \$20 late fee** will be applied to any entry accepted but received after the **closing date**.

GLANBROOK CADORA SHOW AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place in all classes. Prizes may be awarded to 1st and 2nd place winner in classes, subject to availability and sponsors.

High Point of the Day Awards for Glanbrook CADORA Members:

To be eligible for any of the following **Glanbrook CADORA High Point of the Day Awards**, membership in Glanbrook CADORA must be obtained for the **rider** of the horse before the start of the competition.

- **Glanbrook CADORA Bronze Introductory High Point of the day rider** - criteria- rider is Glanbrook CADORA member with highest score in Introductory Test in Bronze Show
- **Glanbrook CADORA Bronze high point of the day rider** – criteria – rider is Glanbrook CADORA member with highest score in Bronze Show
- **Glanbrook CADORA Silver High point of the day rider**- criteria- rider is Glanbrook CADORA member with highest score in Silver Show
- **Glanbrook CADORA Junior High Point of the day rider**- criteria- rider is Glanbrook CADORA Junior member with highest score in Silver or Bronze show **Sponsored by Alison Moeller**
- **MapleLane Trailers Bronze - Level 1 High Point** - criteria- rider is Adult Amateur Glanbrook CADORA member highest score Level 1 Test in Bronze Show **Sponsored by MapleLane Trailers**
- **MapleLane Trailers Silver - Level 1 High Point**- criteria- rider is Adult Amateur Glanbrook CADORA member with highest score Level 1 Test in Silver Show **Sponsored by MapleLane Trailers**

GLANBROOK CADORA ANNUAL YEAR END AWARDS

To be eligible for any of the following **Glanbrook CADORA Annual Year End Awards**, membership in Glanbrook CADORA must be obtained for the **rider** of the horse July 1, 2024.

Year End Annual Awards to be presented at the Annual General Meeting. If the recipient is not able to attend the Annual General Meeting, or to send a representative to accept the award on their behalf, it is the responsibility of the recipient to arrange for delivery of the award.

For the Rider/Horse of the Year, The “Silver Rider”, and each of the High Point Awards, the horse/rider combination must show in a minimum of **three (*)** Glanbrook CADORA Silver and/or Bronze competitions in 2024.

Glanbrook CADORA members who are also a member in good standing with Dressage Niagara and have shown at least two (2) Glanbrook CADORA shows may use scores from one (1) Dressage Niagara 2024 shows towards Glanbrook Year End Awards. You must be a member of both clubs before your scores from Dressage Niagara will count towards Glanbrook CADORA Awards. <http://www.dressageniagara.com/>

➤ **Rider/Horse of the Year Awards:**

Champion, Reserve Champion, and Third place ribbons will be awarded (based on points accumulated throughout the season) in each of Introductory, Training, First, Second, Third, and Fourth Levels. These awards are for **horse/rider** combinations from each of the Bronze and Silver competition series. ***NEW* The three top scores from each of the three in-person shows, will be**

used to calculate the championship placing. At least one of the scores must be from the highest test level of the division (i.e. Test "C" or Test "3"). Prizes presented at the Annual General Meeting.

- **Glanbrook CADORA High Point of the Year Award:**
Highest scoring horse and rider combination with a Senior Glanbrook CADORA member at a Glanbrook CADORA Bronze or Silver Show. Prize presented at the Annual General Meeting - **Sponsored by Maria-Jose Figueira**
- **Don Barnes Vintage "Silver Rider" Award:**
Highest scoring test ridden by a Glanbrook CADORA Member aged 50 years or older, in a 2024 Glanbrook CADORA Bronze or Silver Show EXCLUDING Introductory Division. Rider to identify eligibility with show entry. Prize presented at the Annual General Meeting. No fees to enter other than class fees - **\$100 cash prize provided by Glanbrook CADORA**
- **Glanbrook CADORA Junior High Point of the Year:**
Highest scoring test ridden by a Junior Glanbrook CADORA member in a 2024 Glanbrook CADORA Bronze or Silver Show. Prize presented at the Annual General Meeting- **Sponsored by Alison Moeller**
- **Glanbrook CADORA New Member High Point Award:**
Highest scoring test ridden in a 2024 Glanbrook CADORA Bronze or Silver Show by a Glanbrook Member who was a NEW member in 2024. Prize presented at the Annual General Meeting.
- ***NEW* Glanbrook CADORA Rider 8 Awards:**
Any Glanbrook Cadora member who earned at least one score of "8" or better for the RIDER'S POSITION AND SEAT collective marks in one of the 2024 Glanbrook CADORA Bronze or Silver competitions. \$25 cash prize award to be presented at the Annual General Meeting.
- ***NEW* Coach of the Year Award:**
Licenced Coach with the Highest Accumulated scores from students who are Glanbrook CADORA members will be awarded a Coach of the Year Award. Coach is not required to be a Glanbrook CADORA member, but only scores earned by the students who are members will be eligible to be counted. Licenced Coach must be identified on the entry form, and scores from "self coached" entries will not be counted. \$100 cash prize to be presented at the Annual General Meeting.

CADORA-ONTARIO SILVER CIRCUIT

Did you know that competing in Glanbrook CADORA's Silver Shows can provide you with qualifying scores for the CADORA-Ontario Silver Championships?

You only need 2 scores of 55% or higher from 2 different Silver shows (including Glanbrook CADORA's Silver shows) to qualify. You do not need to be a member to participate in Championships however additional prizes (including cash prizes) are offered to CADORA-Ontario members.

NATIONAL DRESSAGE PONY CUP (CANADIAN AWARDS)

NDPC encourages competition at every level, for riders of any ability, any age and ponies/small horses of any breed, or mix of breeds, to compete and enjoy their experience.

Both Rider and Pony/Small Horse must be registered with the NDPC for the current year by October 31st. Test scores from any Bronze, Silver or Gold dressage show (including Glanbrook CADORA's Bronze or Silver shows) can be submitted including Pony (or Small Horse) classes.
